

Economic Output


- The region's GDP in 2023 was \$14.7 billion.
- Manufacturing was by far the largest contributor to the regional economy at \$3.1 billion.
- Other major sectors were Health Care and Social Assistance (\$1.8 billion), Retail Trade (\$1.3 billion), and Real Estate and Rental and Leasing (\$1.1 billion).

Labor Participation Comparison, 2024

- Regional labor force participation is 55.2 percent, below the comparable state figure of 60.1 percent.
- Among adults 25-54, this discrepancy grows wider (76.3 percent vs. 81.6 percent).
- The participation rate is the percentage of people aged 16 or older who are currently employed or actively seeking employment.


